The fly tying class is open to members and non-members and is taught on Tuesday evenings at 7:00 pm at the MTEC (next to the Ice Rink in White Park).

Those wishing to take the class must enroll at the MTEC office. The fee is \$25 which covers materials and non-members will also receive a one year membership in TU. Fly tying kits are available for use in the class, but you may bring your own vise and tools if you wish. Accomplished fly tyers are welcome to attend at no charge if they wish to assist in instruction. The schedule, flies to be tied and instructors are:

- **Session 1 (Feb. 9): Introduction to fly tying, tools and materials; Woolly Bugger (Harris)**
- **Session 2 (Feb. 16): Hares Ear Nymph (Bott)**
Techniques learned: dubbing bodies, ribbing, forming wing cases
- **Session 3 (Feb. 23): 20 Incher Stonefly Nymph (Bott)**
Techniques learned: tailing and forming fur bodies; hackling wet flies
- **Session 4 (Mar. 2): Light Cahill Dry fly (Harris)**
Techniques learned: Tailing and hackling of a dry fly
- **Session 5 (March 9): Grey Fox Mayfly (Harris)**
- **Session 6 (March 16): Royal Wulff (Harris)**
Techniques learned: calf tail wings and peacock/floss body
- **Session 7 (March 23): Parachute Adams (Bott)**
Techniques learned: Tying and hackling parachute posts
- **Session 8 (March 30): Elk Hair Caddis (Harris)**
Techniques learned: Palmered bodies; use of elk and deer hair as wings
- **Session 9 (April 6): Muddler Minnow (Bott)**
Techniques learned: Spinning deer hair, layered swept back wings
- **Session 10 (April 13): Irresistible: Demonstration by Joe Messinger**
Joes' father invented this fly and has carried on the tradition.
Techniques learned: spinning deer hair; forming bodies
